**Michael L. Ellingwood
ME3
Case No. 2016-036373**

Probable cause was found that Michael L. Ellingwood and ME3 of Miami, FL, a Florida licensed interior designer, entered into a contract to perform general contracting services for a residence. The contract contains professions Mr. Ellingwood is not licensed to perform. Further, the Mr. Ellingwood is offering architectural services through a fictitious name without a certificate of authorization. An Administrative Complaint seeking discipline will be filed.

**Scotty Allen Ford

Probable cause was found that Scotty Allen Ford of Naples, FL, a Florida licensed architect, signed and sealed a false inspection report, on the letterhead of an unlicensed firm, while his licensed was in a delinquent status. An Administrative Complaint seeking discipline will be filed.

**Reza A. Hadaegh
Case No. 2016-028017**

Probable cause was found that Reza A. Hadaegh of Torrance, CA, a Florida licensed architect, affirmed at renewal that he had completed the required continuing education credits. Mr. Hadaegh was chosen for the audit and has not provided proof of the advanced building code course. An Administrative Complaint seeking discipline will be filed.

Probable cause was found that Sarah M. Karram of Boca Raton, FL, a Florida licensed interior designer, affirmed at renewal that she had completed the required continuing education credits. Ms. Karram was chosen for the audit and has only provided evidence of only one hour of continuing education during the audit period. An Administrative Complaint seeking discipline will be filed.

Alexander P. Lamis

Probable cause was found that Alexander P. Lamis of New York, NY, a Florida licensed architect, affirmed at renewal that he had completed the required continuing education credits. Mr. Lamis was chosen for the audit and has only provided evidence of twenty and a half hours of continuing education during the audit period. An Administrative Complaint seeking discipline will be filed.

Carlos Anthony Mindreau

Probable cause was found that Carlos Anthony Mindreau of Coral Gables, FL, a Florida licensed architect, affirmed at renewal that he had completed the required continuing education credits. Mr. Mindreau was chosen for the audit and has only provided evidence of twenty one hours of continuing education during the audit period. An Administrative Complaint seeking discipline will be filed.
