Carlos I. Alcalá
Alcalá Architecture, LLC
Case No. 2016-042489

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing a fine of \$1,000.00 plus costs against Carlos I. Alcalá’s license to practice architecture. Mr. Alcalá is aiding an unlicensed firm in the offering of architectural services.

Michael E. Craddock
Case No. 2015-022690

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed enter a final order imposing a fine of \$1,000.00 plus costs against Michael E. Craddock. Michael E. Craddock was previously licensed; however, his license went delinquent on March 1, 2003, and then into a null and void status on March 1, 2005. Mr. Craddock contracted for architectural services, held himself out as an architect and used his null and void license number.

Gregory Sterling Goertler
Case Nos. 2014-047226
2015-041648

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing reprimand plus costs against Gregory Sterling Goertler’s license to practice architecture. Mr. Goertler aided the unlicensed practice of architecture by signing a letter with his license number on the letterhead of an unlicensed firm for a commercial project.

Chris Haywood
West Coast Drafting
Case No. 2015-011702

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed enter a final order imposing a fine of \$1,000.00 plus costs against Chris Haywood and West Coast Drafting. Chris Haywood and West Coast Drafting are not licensed to practice architecture and Mr. Haywood is holding himself out as an architect to clients.

HDR Architecture, Inc.
Case No. 2016-057964

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing costs against HDR Architecture, Inc.'s license to practice architecture. HDR Architecture, Inc. represented in bid documents that an individual was a licensed architect when he did not have an active license. Further, they failed to notify DBPR that its qualifier passed away in 2003.

Eduardo Hillman-Waller
Case No. 2016-009261

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order imposing costs plus 48 hours of continuing education against Eduardo Hillman-Waller's license to practice architecture. Mr. Hillman-Waller affirmed at renewal that he had completed the required continuing education hours. Mr. Hillman-Waller was chosen for the audit and has not provided any hours.

Eduardo Hillman-Waller
Case No. 2017-027166

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order imposing a fine of \$1,000.00 plus costs and two years probation against Eduardo Hillman-Waller's license to practice architecture. Mr. Hillman-Waller was convicted of conspiracy to commit wire fraud and transport money obtained by fraud while acting as the project manager for the Piarco International Airport serving Trinidad and Tobago.

Guillermo A. Lugones
Case No. 2016-020262

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order imposing fine of \$500.00 plus costs, proof of taking the advanced building code course and suspension until compliance against Guillermo A. Lugones's license to practice architecture. Mr. Lugones affirmed at renewal that he had completed the required hours. Mr. Lugones was chosen for the audit and has not provided proof of having taken the Building Code course.

Ruben J. Pujol
Case No. 2016-038021

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order imposing a fine of \$2,000.00 plus costs and two years probation against Ruben J. Pujol's license to practice architecture. Mr. Pujol was providing responsibility supervisory control over two architectural firms and at two different locations.

Gerard J. Vermey
Case No. 2015-011707

The Florida Board of Architecture and Interior Design agreed to enter a final order approving a settlement stipulation imposing reprimand, a fine of \$3,000.00 plus costs and appearance at the May 12, 2017 Board meeting against Gerard J. Vermey's license to practice architecture. Mr. Vermey signed and sealed deficient plans. Further, Mr. Vermey providing responsible supervisory control for two different business locations.
